Our books were “3 Billy Goats Gruff” and “The Biggest Apple Ever”. Our special project was using scissors to cut colored paper then gluing them into a shape. They will use their hands to create art projects, build a block tower, explore outdoor nature with magnifying glasses, and sort colors for sensory play. Homework will include the letter “T” collage, numbers (1-6), and the shape heart. Kindergartener’s homework will include the book “A Trip”, sight word: “a” and letters: Qq, Rr, Ss, Tt, and math consisting of ABB patterns, shapes/colors, and use a geoboard to understand basic geometry concepts! Last week’s learning focus was “My Five Senses”! The children learned about the five senses, drew pictures of objects that they can smell, made a tasty necklace, and participated in a

1st & 2nd Grade News from Mrs.

Deborah Steinacher: For the week of Sept. 19, memory will be #6-7 for first grade and #46 for second. In religion we will be learning about the Ten Commandments. We will relate them to our own lives. In reading and spelling we will be on unit 1.5. While reading we will be looking for key details, the theme of the stories, and looking at what we can learn from the stories. In language we will be learning what an adjective does in a sentence and how to identify it. In math we will be using our mental math skills, measuring a line segment to the nearest half inch, finding sums greater than 100, adding with regrouping, and continuing to memorize our math facts. In social studies we will be learning about some of our country's symbols. In science we will be using magnets in several classroom activities. Our book report is due Wednesday, Sept. 21. Please help your child with this at home. They may be sent in on or before the due date. We would like to thank Ben for providing us with our afternoon snack. We all greatly appreciate our snack and read aloud break. We are busy working on our song "Father Welcomes." We will be singing this is church on Sunday, October 9. They are doing a great job of learning the verses. Have a wonderful week! God's blessings.

3rd. 4th & 5th Grade News from Mrs.

Blayre Petri: In 3rd and 4th grade we will be starting unit 1 week 5 in reading. The folktale story we will be reading in 3rd grade is titled "Roadrunner's Dance". We will also be reading a folktale in 4th grade titled "The Secret Message". The students will not only read these in class, but also be expected to read

these at home before the test on Friday. During the week we will be working on the vocabulary from each story along with comprehension. In spelling the students will be working on their new words that also come from unit 1 week 5. The 3rd and 4th grade words will both be emphasizing the long o sound. In grammar we will be focusing on simple and compound sentences in 3rd grade, while talking about types of run-on sentences in 4th grade. This week in math we will be working on lessons 16-19 in both 3rd and 4th grade books. The 3rd graders will be working on adding three-digit numbers, comparing and ordering, some and some more stories, and subtracting three-digit numbers. The 4th graders will be working on expanded form, adding columns of numbers with regrouping, temperature, and elapsed time problems. In science we will be identifying characteristics of eukaryotic cells, identifying organisms with eukaryotic cells and using a microscope to observe protists. In social studies we will begin talking about Americans and their history starting with Abraham Lincoln. The students are continuing to practice the hymn "Father Welcomes" in choir along with other fun Christian songs. We will also continue to explore different styles of art on Friday.
