Last week's learning focus was Animal Hibernation: The students learned about animals that hibernate, why they need to hibernate, and that the animals do not sleep but are just taking an extra-long nap during the winter months.

1st & 2nd Grade News from Mrs.

Deborah Steinacher: For the week of November 14, memory for first grade will be 14 and memory for second will be 54. In religion we will be learning about Solomon's temple. In reading and spelling we will be on unit 3.2. While reading we will be thinking about the problem in the story, the setting, the main characters, and how the problem was solved. We will also relate the story to ourselves. In math we will be identifying parallel lines, estimating sums, comparing using symbols, multiplying, and working with fractions. In social studies we will be working with finding the main idea and the key details. We will also be learning about supply and demand, and that trading means to buy, sell, or exchange goods or services. In science we are learning about force. We will be learning how gravity and friction affect force. We would like to thank Isaiah for providing us with our afternoon snack next week. Our next book report is due Nov. 22. If you want, use a book that is also AR. They may be turned in at any time. We are working on songs for the children's Christmas service. They are doing a great job of learning the songs! This is a wonderful opportunity for the students to tell the Good News of Jesus' birth. Have a wonderful week. God's blessings!

3rd. 4th & 5th Grade News from Mrs.

Blayre Petri: For the week of November 14th - November 18th we will be on unit 3 week 3 in

reading for both grades. The fourth grade class will read a Biography titled Delivering Justice. The third grade will be reading the expository text titled Earth. The students will work on reading this story along with other short reads throughout the week. We will work on vocabulary and comprehension as well. In spelling this week the third grade words will be focusing on r-controlled vowels using ar and ir and the fourth grade words will focus on the soft g and c sound. In grammar this week we will be talking about main and helping verbs, more past-tense verbs, punctuation in contractions, and mechanics and abbreviations and name titles. In handwriting we will be reviewing the cursive lowercase o's and begin cursive lowercase w. In math we will be working on chapters 45-48 in both grades. In Social Studies we will be beginning our Unit 3 lesson 1 discussing the principles of our Government. In science we will finish up our lesson 12 over vascular and nonvascular plants. We continue to practice our Christmas songs daily and the students are really having fun with it. God Bless, Mrs. Petri
