PRESCHOOL 3's from: Mrs. Wiegand: This week and next we will learn about the very first thanksgiving and what we are thankful for. We watched a video about Squanto, the native Indian who helped the pilgrims grow crops and taught them how to fish and hunt in the new On Indian day we made Indian land. headbands, played drums and sang an Indian song. We learned about the Teepee and the cornucopia "Horn of plenty" basket that the Indians made to gather food in. On pilgrim day we read about the long journey on a ship. We made a handprint pilgrim and Indian friends' picture. We built log cabins with Lincoln logs, made turkey cookies and a turkey decoration. We traced Teepee triangles, searched for triangle and counted and drew feathers on turkeys. Our sensory bin offered a look at Indian corn and yellow corn. Stories for the week were "Count Down to Thanksgiving", "The Turkey Train," "Turkey Trouble," "This First Thanksgiving Day", 10- Fat Turkeys", "The Very Stuffed Turkey", and "God Gave Us Thankful Hearts". We will enjoy our own mini thanksgiving meal during snack. May you all enjoy and remember the many things you are thankful for this Thanksgiving Season. May God Bless!

PRESCHOOL 4's & KINDERGARTEN News from Mrs. Lysaythong:. Learning Focus: Cooking in the Kitchen. This week the students are learning about their favorite food that they like to cook in the kitchen with their parents. Included are discussions about fire safety and how the students should never touch anything that is hot. For math the students practiced measuring flour and water and then they mixed them together and created a pancake batter. During the cooking process, the students used their scientific methods to observe the liquid batter being cooked by the teacher transforming it into a solid shape of a circle or pancakes! The students will finish off their week with making fresh strawberry lemonade and going to Leo's Pizza to create their personal pizza, bake it, and eat it!



Next week will be a short week but filled with fun and exciting arts and crafts about what the students are thankful for. They will continue to work on writing their names, cutting, coloring, painting, and creating a paperplate turkey! Last week's learning focus was Nocturnal Animals: The students learned about animals that come out at night and how they are different from day animals. Through our scientific research the students discovered that nocturnal animals like dolphins uses high frequency sound waves to give them a picture of their surroundings and for other night animals they have special eye lenses that reflect light to help them see in the dark!

1st & 2nd Grade News from Mrs. Deborah Steinacher: For the week of November 21, there will be no regular memory, reading, or spelling due to the short week. Instead we will review our word wall, work on memorizing our songs and recitations for the Christmas service, and the main idea and key

details of a story. In math we will be multiplying by 1, 10, 100, 2, 5, and 3. We will also be adding three digit numbers, identifying cup, quart, gallon, and liter, and problem solving. In social studies we will be talking about making choices and reasons to save our money. In science we will learn how wheels make work easier. We will also be doing a couple of Thanksgiving projects to help the class remember to give thanks to God for all of our blessings. For the week of November 28, memory for first grade will be 15, and memory for second will be 55. In religion we will be learning about Elijah and when God spoke to him. For the last week in November we will be on unit 3.3 for reading and spelling. We will be reading both fantasy and nonfiction stories. This will give us a chance to compare the two types of stories. In language we will continue to work with identifying singular and plural nouns. In math we will be working on geometric solids, adding large numbers, rounding, writing mixed numbers, and identifying right angels. In social studies we will be learning about borrowing money. In science we will be learning about wheels, axles, types of things with wheels and axles, and how they help make work easier. Our next book report is due Nov. 22. Please send them in any time. We will be having left over for the week of November 21 and November 28. Have a wonderful week. God's blessings.
