1st & 2nd Grade News from Mrs.

Deborah Steinacher: For the week of December 5-9, for memory we will be working really hard to know our songs and recitations. We have been working on them since before Christmas. Blayre Petri: For the week of December 5th - 9th we will be starting unit 3 week 5 in both reading and spelling. In reading the 4th grade will be reading a persuasive article titled "A New Kind of Corn." The 3rd grade will be reading an expository text titled "Riding the Rails West." We will work on reading these stories along with going over vocabulary during the week. In 4th grade we will be talking about irregular verbs and correct verb usage in grammar. In 3rd grade grammar we will be working on combining sentences with verbs, subject-verb agreement when combining sentences and punctuation in letters, dates, addresses, and locations. In math we will be working on chapters 55-59. In social studies we will be talking about the United States since World War II. We will also have a small quiz over lessons 4 and 5 in Chapter 2 on Friday, December 9. In Science we will be reviewing for a Lesson 12 test that will be on Tuesday, December 6th and start Lesson 13.
