This week the class has been learning about the meaning of why we use certain decorations and traditions at Christmas time. We are also learning about how Christmas is celebrated around the world in other countries. Writing of our names is coming along nicely and we are practicing cutting shapes with scissors. PRESCHOOL 4's & KINDERGARTEN News from Mrs. Lysaythong:

Learning Focus: Snowman This week the students are learning about what it takes to make a snowman. The students started their week by listening to stories about a snowman, began their long-term paper clay project, and will proceed with their ABC's phonics sounds as well as high frequency words. For handwriting the students will persist in writing their first and last names as independently as possible and recognize/identify numbers 0-13. The Kindergarteners will carry on with counting by 2's and 3's; work on telling time with a clock, and read their weekly books to strengthen reading comprehension and language skills! Last week's learning focus was Snowflakes. The students learned that not two snowflakes are alike and how some are already broken during its downward trajectory journey. For science the students recognized that the formation of snowflakes takes place in the clouds not from freezing rain. For art the students painted and cut out snowflakes to enhance their creativity and eye-hand coordination!



1st & 2nd Grade News from Mrs. Deborah Steinacher:

For the week of Dec. 12 there will be no regular memory. Instead we will be working on putting the finishing touches on our songs and recitation. There will also be no regular reading or spelling. Instead we will be practicing the Christmas service. In math we will be predicting outcomes, making and labeling arrays, and showing transformations, rotations, and reflections. In social studies we are learning about trading with other countries. In science we will be working with wheels and axles and reviewing some of our science concepts. We will be having left overs for our afternoon snack. On Friday we will be doing a variety of activities to celebrate
