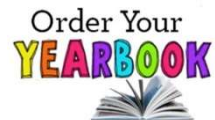

PRE-SCHOOL 3's from: Mrs. Wiegand: This week we are learning about the life cycle of the Butterfly. We will also cover ants, spiders, and fireflies. Our stories are "The Very Hungry Caterpillar", "The Very Busy Spider," "The Very Quiet Cricket", and "The Very Lonely Firefly," all by Eric Carl. Since this is a short week, we will start our unit on birds next week. We will be bird watching from our classroom perch (window) with binoculars. We will discover the different types of nest and colorful eggs also. In these activities we will incorporate counting and doing letters to object matching. PRE-SCHOOL 4's & KINDERGARTEN News from Mrs. Lysaythong: Learning Focus: Frogs. This

week the students are learning about frogs! They will learn the difference between a frog and a toad, increase awareness about regular frogs and poisonous frogs, various geographic/places where they might find a frog, and explore the life cycle of a frog. In art the students will create their own 3-D frogs with foil and clay and paint it towards the end of the week! Last week's learning focus was Spring is Here! The students learned that in spring the weather starts to get warmer, trees begin to sprout buds or tiny leaves, and flowers bloom to attract insects and butterflies. Also it is a time where birds lay their eggs, animals come out from their winter hibernation, and farmers plant their vegetables. For science the students researched about seeds and what it needs to grow. They picked out their own seeds and planted them inside a small pot of soil. To help the students learn about the letter of the week, they each drew a picture that starts with the letter "Ss"!



3rd, 4th & 5th Grade News from Mrs. Blayre Petri: During the week of the 17th through the 21st we will be on chapter 6 week 4 in both reading and spelling for both grades. In fourth grade spelling the words will all have suffixes. The third grade spelling words have r-controlled vowel syllables. The third grade story for the week is a science based expository text titled "Alligators and Crocodiles." The fourth grade story is a social studies based expository text titled "The Big Picture of Economics." The students will be working on comprehension and vocabulary throughout the week. In third grade grammar we will be talking about adverbs that compare, and using more and most. The fourth grade will be working on prepositions, prepositional phrases, and review using quotations. In social studies we will continue talking about the midwest and start preparing for the southwest states test. The students will also be taking their standardized tests during the morning hours of this week. God Bless, Mrs. Petri

1st & 2nd Grade News from Mrs. Deborah Steinacher: For the week of April 17, there will be no regular memory, reading, or spelling due to achievement tests being done each morning. The following week we will be back on a normal schedule. In religion we will be learning about when Jesus appears to the disciples and Thomas. Then we will be learning about Jesus' ascension into heaven. In math we will be working with equal groups, lines of symmetry, products and quotients, and polygons. In language we are continuing to find and fix sentence fragments. In social studies we are learning about the different things that are part of our culture. So far we know that music, religion, food, language, and customs are all part of our culture. In science we will be learning about how light travels in a straight line and how it can pass through some types of matter. Our next book report is due April 25. Please be working on this at home.
