

Also, along with the Earth Day curriculum the students will be watching the movie "The Lorax" to help them better understand the importance of trees and why we must care for the beautiful Earth that God has created for everyone! Last week's learning focus was Frogs!! The students learned about the various types of frogs, their habitat, and life cycle. For art the students used foil, air dry clay and molded into a frog. As we read our stories, we will be working on word recognition, fluency, and comprehension. In math we will be working on equal groups, lines of

symmetry, problem solving, division, polygons, and fractions. In language we are working on learning how to make fragments into complete sentences. In social studies we are continuing to learn about how cultures are the same. In science we are learning about the colors in a rainbow. Our memory, reading, and spelling tests will be on Thursday due to a teacher workday on Friday. We would like to thank Skyah for providing us with our afternoon snack next week. 3rd. 4th & 5th Grade News from Mrs. Blayre Petri: Standardized testing week is not the most fun week but a week that is needed and the kids pushed through! Since we did not have our spelling and reading tests during the week of the 10th, we will now do chapter 6 week 4 for both reading and spelling for both grades. In fourth grade spelling the words will all have suffixes. The third-grade spelling words have r-controlled vowel syllables. The third-grade story for the week is a science based expository text titled "Alligators and Crocodiles." The fourth-grade story is a social studies based expository text titled "The Big Picture of Economics." The students will be working on comprehension and vocabulary throughout the week. In third grade grammar we will be talking about adverbs that compare and use more and more. The fourth grade will be working on prepositions, prepositional phrases, and review using quotations. In social studies we will continue talking about the Midwest and add the southwest states to our group! It is hard to believe this is the last week of April and we are nearing the end!
