We are tlaking about how goods are made or grown by people and that people, such as doctors and teachers, provide services to the community. In math students are learning about problem solving, describing different shapes, and AB and ABB patterns. In science we are learning about pets and how to take

1st & 2nd Grade News from Mrs. Deborah Steinacher: For the week of Oct. 23, memory for the first grade will be #11 and memory for second grade will be #51. In religion we will be learning about when God sent Deborah to guide and direct His people. In reading and spelling we will be on unit 2.5. We will be working with poetry and learning how to get information from maps. The next set of spelling words for unit 3 will be soon coming home. A few book reports are due on Oct. 24. Please keep working on them at home. In math we will be continuing to work on borrowing and rounding in math. We have also begun working on multiplying. We have been working with multiplying by 0, 1, 5, and 10. In social studies we will be finishing up chapter 2. Chapter 3 will be on looking at our world and where things are located. In science we will be learning about the life stages of a tree. We will be learning about what the rings on a tree mean. In language we are learning about more of the parts of speech and how to label them. We have added adjective articles to what we know. We would like to thank Carlee for providing us with our afternoon snack next week. We all greatly appreciate our snack break. Singing in church will soon be here.
