Lysaythong::: This week's learning focus is "Fall". The students are learning about the change of seasons summer to fall, exploring evidence of autumn within their outdoor environment, and using coffee filters to create fall leaves. They will focus on the letter Mm, the number 8, and journaling for to enhance their cognitive, writing, and language developments! Last week's learning focus was "Sea Animals"! The students learned about sea animals, how they breathe underwater, communicate, and how they hunt for food. For art the students used clay and molded their favorite sea creatures, studied marine life habitat, and practiced recognizing/identifying the letter Ss and its phonics sound.

#### Kindergarten News from Mrs. Audrey Sprinkel:

We have been having a great time in kindergarten! This week in reading, we are talking about shapes that we see around us! We will be working together as a class to find shapes in our classroom, and create a chart to see what shape we see more of in our room. In math we are learning about ordinal positions to the 4th, telling time to the hour, and learning to count money to 10 cents. Students will be introduced to our play store, where they can practice handling money, and counting the money. In science we are continuing to talk about healthy habits, and we will be talking about healthy foods. To help students identify healthy foods we will be playing a food game, and having a healthy snack! In social studies we are continuing to talk about the types of jobs people have, as well as the types of jobs we do at home and in school! We have been learning a lot of social emotional skills in class, and this past week we talked about "The Magical Yet" and read the book. Students are learning that just because they cannot do something now doesn't mean they won't be able to do it forever. They just can't do it yet, and it may take time and practice, but they will someday be able to do things they cannot do today! Have a fantastic week, God Bless!

1<sup>st</sup> & 2nd Grade News from Mrs. Deborah Steinacher: For the week of Oct. 10, memory for first grade will be #9 and memory for second grade will be #49. In religion we will be learning about Moses and the Ten Commandments. In reading and spelling we will be on Unit 2.3. While reading we will be looking for facts. We will compare the facts we learn to the facts we already know. In math we will be working with fractions, writing numbers in expanded form, and using both the dollar sign and the cent sign when writing money amounts. In language will be be learning about adjective and how they help a sentence. In social studies we will be learning about the differences between buying and selling. In science we will be learning about the seasons and how they affect deciduous trees. Before we begin writing, we will be reading about Christopher Columbus. We will be taking notes on what we learned about Columbus. Then we will be learning how to turn our notes into a story about Columbus. Our first book report is due Oct. 24. Thank you for helping your child read a book and then report on it. The book reports may be turned in any time on or before Oct. 24. For snack we will be having left overs. Thank you to everyone for the weekly snacks. Left over week is always fun to see what snacks we will have. Have a wonderful week. God's blessings to everyone.

3rd. 4th & 5th Grade News from Mrs. Jacqueline Steinacher: This week, we hosted chapel by performing skits on God's omniscience, omnipotence, and omnipresence. The class worked in groups to write their own scripts, and they spent many hours practicing

and rehearsing their lines. I am extremely proud of their performance! In Social Studies this week, we are learning how to determine cause and effect, as well as how people use their environment. We will have a Chapter 2 test on Thursday. This test is open book and will cover our unit on geography, climate, and the environment. We will also have a guiz on Thursday over the Middle Atlantic states and their abbreviations. In Science, we are continuing our unit on Chemistry by learning about the elements we see in our everyday lives. We will look at nutrition labels to see what elements our bodies need to be healthy. In Math, we are working through units 36-39, which cover subtraction across zeroes. rounding, and multiplication. We will not have a math test this week. In Spelling, we are on List 7. Due to the short week, our spelling test is on Thursday. In Language, we are discussing singular and possessive plural nouns. In Reading, we are in Unit 2, Week 2; with a reading comprehension test on Thursday. We thank the Siegel family for our snacks this week.
