PRESCHOOL Pre-K2 News from Mrs. Wilson:

Learning Focus: Friendship and Love Bible Story: David and Goliath We are also focused on the number 7: how we count to 7 and make the number 7. We have been focused on red, blue, pink, and purple colors. We know the shapes of: circle, triangle, diamond, heart, stars, and squares. Not only are we focused on how David trusted in God to help beat Goliath with 5 stones we are learning about Noah's Ark this week. We have introduced new gross motor play items like balloons and playing hungry hip-po with them. We will also beading in a cooking day where the children and I make one snack a week. This will help with math by using measuring cups as well as fine motor skills and even more fun in our classroom- stay tuned! PRE-SCHOOL Pre-K4 News from Ms. Minday Lysaythong:

Learning Focus: Dental Hygiene: This week's learning focus is "Dental Hygiene". The students will learn how to take better care for their teeth, why having healthy teeth is important, and understanding the role that teeth play in our daily lives such as eating, chewing, and nutrition! The students will create a happy tooth vs a sad tooth collage and a healthy mouth puppet for visual art expressions. They will continue to practice identifying/counting numbers 1-20 in English and Spanish and work on their pre-reading skills with short vowels: a, e, i, o, u, and sometimes y! Last week's learning focus was "Valentine's Day"! The students discussed and shared what Valentine's Day meant to them and their families. During their Valentine's Day party the students took a group photo, passed out cards, took turns hitting a piñata and celebrated the special day with red, white, pinks snacks! In art the students decorated their Valentine's bags and created a heart collage!

Hello, we have been working on the letter M, the number 8, as well as the shape Octagon. We are learning about the bible story of the David & Goliath as well as what Friendship & caring for others is this month. We talked about what being a friend is and different terms that are used for friendship. This week we have made friendship beading, working our friendship petals for the big friendship flowers that will go in our hallway. We have a few different activities and ways that we will be painting this week. Showing the kids that there is many ways to paint and things to paint with. We will be painting with bubbles, painting rocks, and even some salt painting. We are going to start working on our auction painting as well. Steinacher: For the week of Feb. 26, memory for first grade will be #22 and memory for second grade will be #62. In religion we will be learning about when Jesus healed the ten lepers and one returned to thank Jesus. In reading and spelling we will be on unit 5.3. In reading we will be reading some nonfiction stories. We will look at what makes a story nonfiction and compare it to fiction stories. In language we are continuing to work on a variety of poems. In math we will be working with time to five minute intervals, making a table to solve a problem, and using a pictograph and a bar graph to locate information. In social studies we will be comparing people to see how we are alike and different. In science we will continue to learn about our skeleton and senses. We would like to thank Kirk for providing us with our afternoon snack next week. The March calendar and book report will soon be coming home. We are looking forward to singing on Palm Sunday. 3rd 4th & 5th Grade News from Mrs. Jacqueline

Steinacher: After a few short weeks, we are looking forward to having a full week of school so we can tackle some of our ongoing class projects! We have begun working on our project for the Spring Auction. Please continue to send in grocery sacks (we will end up using over 200 bags!) For the week of February 26, we will continue looking at state capitals in the Southeast region. We will have a quiz on Friday over the capitals for KY, TN, AL, MS, AR, LA, OK, and TX. In Social Studies, we will continue our unit on citizenship by discussing taking action for a cause. We are also going to begin looking at the United States Constitution and why it is important. In Science, we will continue our unit on Geology by learning about the Earth's layers and plate tectonics. In math, we will work on units 95-97, which cover estimation, rounding to the nearest dollar, multiplying 3-digit numbers, two-step word problems, and statistics. We will have a Math test on Friday. In Language Arts, we will begin Unit 5.4, with reading and spelling tests on Friday. 3rd grade will read selections about what it means to be a good citizen, study possessive and reflexive pronouns, and spell words by changing 'y' to 'i'. 4th grade will read selections about discovery, learn about using more/most, combine sentences, and spell words with r-controlled vowels.

Middle School has been talking about bacterial versus viral diseases in science. We are learning ways to be safe around others and how to treat different diseases. We are finishing up ancient China and are discussing China's changes once the trade routes open to the West, particularly the silk road. In math we are covering probabilities, scatter plots, differentiation equations and many other topics. We are finishing our monocratic paintings in art, and continue to work through our poetry unit in Language Arts.
