

#### **PRESCHOOL Pre-K2 News from Mrs. Wilson &**

**Ms. Manson:** Learning Focus: Types of Weather; Bible Story: The Easter Story. We are now focusing on numbers 11-15, the color of green and the months of the year. We review our shapes by playing a game called 'Around the World,' and I think most of us know the shapes- so that is exciting! We are focused this month on all types of weather and how they are made. Our art will center on this. May will be focused on more Bible stories and summer fun. Thank you to the parents who came to our auction last weekend, we had a big turnout, and our class gift went for \$250! Thanks for all your help. Class field trip money is due May 3<sup>rd</sup> with the permission slip; I can't wait to show you all the museum!



#### **PRESCHOOL Pre-K3 News from Ms. Christy**


**Martin:** This week we have been working on the letter T and number 14. The kids have been working hard on their fine motor skills with holding their writing utensils correctly as well as holding and using scissors correctly. We will be discussing more about weather and all the things to do with weather this week. This week we are learning about shadows and when they can show up and when we don't have shadows and why. We took some toys outside with paper to draw/trace the shadows that were created. In the classroom we discussed what shadows are created when our lights are on, and the sun is shining in the

classroom. We will continue to learn about the wind and what weather comes with the wind. Pre-k will be creating windsocks, wind-blown paintings, and windy art printmaking. I want to thank you all again for helping provide supplies for our auction project with two baskets full of family art night fun and the class painting. The project was purchased by the PreK 2 teacher, Ms. Wilson, and she said that the painting should be with the classroom, therefore the kids now still get to admire and check out the painting they did together as will the classes after them. We are working on a school play for our fine arts night in May. Our class has lines to say as a group!! They will also be doing an art piece for that night as well. More details to come.



#### **PRE-SCHOOL Pre-K4 News from Ms. Mindy**

**Lysaythong:** Learning Focus: Snow Weather; This week's learning focus is "Snow Weather". The students are learning about snow blizzards, snowflakes, snowmen, and how snow is formed. For art they will paint and create sparkly blizzards and salt icicles. They will listen to snow books. In math the students will practice identifying numbers 1-30, play a number hopscotch game, and put together 30+ puzzle pieces. Students will continue to practice reading and writing their phonics words based on their individual levels and learn how to say snow in Spanish! Last week's learning focus was "Tornados". The students learned about the various types of tornados, drew tornado pictures, created ripped paper tornados, watched the solar eclipse and created their own rice crispy pop for fun Friday!



**Kindergarten News from Mrs. Audrey Sprinkel:** We have so many things happening this week! This week is testing week for grades K-8. Please do not let your child miss school this week as testing is going on daily. In reading, we are talking about how animals are alike and how they are different. We will be reading about animals and learning about different animals in our world. In math, we are learning about how to write addition sentences, working with pictographs, dividing solids in half, and counting. In social studies, students are learning about how each person and every child has a past that we call our personal history. In science we are learning about living and nonliving things and how we can identify if something is living or not. In religion we are continuing to talk about sharing the Good News of Jesus, and learning how we can share the Good News with others. In art, we are working on recyclable art! If you have any recyclables, we would love to take those out of your hands! You can send items in with your students! We are so excited to show you all we have been working on! **3<sup>rd</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> & 5<sup>th</sup> Grade News from Mrs. Jacqueline**

**Steinacher:** Greetings from Mrs. Steinacher! After a week of testing, we are ready to get back to a normal week of school! We are excited for our upcoming field trip on April 26 to Hadden Farms, where we will apply the concepts, we have learned from our agriculture class with Mrs. Hadden. For the week of April 22, we will take all our regular tests on Thursday due to the field trip on Friday. In Social Studies, we are continuing our unit on commerce by discussing goods and services. In Science, we have begun our unit on botany, and will perform a lab about seed germination. In Math, we are finishing up our last few units before we begin to prepare for the end-of-the-year exam.
