PRESCHOOL Pre-K2 News from Ms. Bethany Malone, Mrs. Mary Schultz & Mrs. Ashley Smith: Hello Pre-K2 Families!!! The second week of school has come and gone. We're moving right through August. This week will be the last week we learn about the number 1, the letter A, the color red, and the circle. This week we introduced the 2nd commandment, the 2nd line of the Lord's Prayer, and the 2nd line of Apostle's Creed. Also, as I mentioned before we adopted a Calf!! Her name is Salem, and the kids absolutely adore her! Our theme this month in Enduring the race that God has set before you. The Bible story I have chosen for this week will be "Out of Egypt". We made Footprints of Moses parting the Red Sea. Last week we learned all about the 7 plagues and Moses and Aaron having to carry messages between God and Pharaoh. A couple of reminders! PRESCHOOL Pre-K3 News from Ms. Martin & Mrs. Bezler: Each morning in Pre-K 3 we discuss the Month of the year, Day of the week, and Date of the month. When doing this these kids are learning the concept of a calendar, word recognition, number and date recognition as well. We then will listen to "Days of the Week" by Dr. Jean to the tune of Adam's Family, and the kids are starting to catch onto the song. We use this song for memory and rhythm, learning that there's certain times to clap and certain times not to clap. When we discuss the date, they are learning to recognize single and double numbers at once. We have reviewed more on the letter S and started to learn the letter A. The kids are really enjoying learning the letters in sign language along with the letter lesson, showing us they can hold their hand the certain way. For math and numbers, we review 3 and jump to 5. Doing them out of order assists the brain to think a little harder for the placement of numbers as well as assisting in the number recognition. Number 3 and 5 are ones that can be tricky to write for little ones as well; therefore, we study them together for understanding and memorization. A couple reminders: spirit wear forms we sent out and are due by the end of the month. There were also Scholastic Book Order Forms that went home last week that can be ordered on-line as well. There will be new book orders every couple month

PRE-SCHOOL Pre-K4 News from Ms. Candy West & Mrs. Khristina Seaton: Our friends in the pre-K4 classroom have been practicing those first names that they are learning and utilizing the writing center to form their other letters more creatively. We have been working on the numbers 3 and 4 while reviewing the numbers 1 and 2. We have reviewed the upper and lower case letter A's, and we have been working on our upper and lowercase B's, and will be starting the C soon. The students enjoy the teepee in the reading center and are working on choosing a story that they can read to the class next week. Of course, their story will be more interesting than that which is in print. They

enjoy expressing themselves using art and we have shared a few of their art projects in the preschool hallway upstairs. Next week we start the family tree project where one student brings in pictures and introduces their family to the class. We honor them for approximately 10 days and then this privilege rotates to another student in the class. The school year has started off very nicely for our families and I'm sure they will continue in the coming weeks!

<u>Kindergarten - 2nd Grade News from Mrs. Deborah</u> Steinacher: For the week of Sept. 3, we will be working on learning Psalm 146: 1-3. In religion we will be learning about when Isaac blesses his sons. In reading and spelling we will be on Unit 1.3. As we read, we will look for the main character and relate the story to ourselves. We will work with comprehending what we read, sounding out words, and looking for word families. In math we will be learning about graphs patterns, telling time, even and odd, and lines of symmetry. In social studies we are continuing to learn how we all can be good citizens of our community. In science we will finish up learning about the stages of an infant to an elderly adult. We would like to thank Quinton for providing us with our afternoon snacks. We all greatly appreciate our snack break.
