Working together with the students on each of their names helps the children with their memorization of letters and their friends' names. The students have been improving their line tracing. We are continuing to work on our fine motor skills to assist with their handwriting skills. We have read the Bible story "Best Friends" from 1 Samuel 16:14-23; 18-20. We learned what it means to be a good friend even when we are far away from our friends. With the Bible story this week, we will be creating friendship bracelets, a friendship tree, and a friendship puzzle. This week we are learning more about different shapes and the number of sides they may have. We have our first preschool field trip on Monday, October 28th, to the Market Six pumpkin patch.
