PRESCHOOL Pre-K2 News from Ms. Bethany Malone, Mrs. Mary Schultz: Hello Pre-K2 Families!!! This week we introduced the 8th commandment, the entirety of the Lord's Prayer, and the entirety of Apostle's Creed. Every day I notice more and more students able to say these things along with me instead of repeating after me! I have introduced "10 Commandments for kids" and this week we are focusing on commandment 8 "thou shall not give false testimony about thy neighbor." Our theme this month is David and Goliath. The Bible story I have chosen for this week will be "David and Goliath" We will be painting David's stones, measuring to see how tall Goliath would have been, and discussing why David was able to beat Goliath. Mrs. Bezler: Welcome to October!!!! The kids had an amazing time this week with it being Fire Safety week and had a visit from our local Firefighters. They have learned about the trucks and the gear that they wear to keep them safe while fighting fires. This week we are starting to work on the letter Oo and continuing to work on the numbers that we have learned so far this year. We have read the bible Story Israel's First King this week and learned that God helped Samuel find Saul and made him a King. We are continuing to work on our fine motor skills to assist with their handwriting skills. It's crazy to think that the first quarter is now over. Assessments on each of the children have started to be ready for the parent teacher conferences next week. PRE-SCHOOL Pre-K4 News from Ms. Candy West & Mrs. Khristina Seaton In the Pre-K 4 classroom this week we have been working with the number 8 and the letters G and g. The students have had fun nesting blocks in color patterns. We know that the season has changed from Summer to Fall, and the children are looking forward to cooler temperatures. We now have the first 30 days of the school year behind us, and I think even the children agree that it has sped by. We have discovered that our students like to have their hands traced and they also enjoy lacing (I call it sewing) activities that we have been doing. In Math, we have been learning different ways to make five: you can remind your students in years to come that they started their algebra careers at the young age of 4.

Kindergarten – 2nd Grade News from Mrs. Deborah Steinacher: For the week of Oct. 15, we will continue to learn Psalm 46. There will be no regular reading or spelling due to the short school week. Instead, we will be reviewing a variety of skills. In math we will continue to work with even and odd numbers, pictographs, line segments, congruent shapes, patterns, telling time, and fractional parts of a set. In language we are learning about the differences between a statement and a question. In science we will be learning about the different ways that deciduous trees change in the seasons. In social studies we will be learning how needs and wants are different. It is the end of the quarter, and I am looking forward to visiting with each

of you during parent teacher conferences. This is a wonderful opportunity for us to share ideas, show off what the students are learning, and to look at goals for each student.
