PRESCHOOL Pre-K2 News from Ms. Bethany Malone, Mrs. Mary Schultz: Hello Pre-K2 This week we introduced the 9th Families!!! commandment, the entirety of the Lord's Prayer, and the entirety of Apostle's Creed. Every day I notice more and more students able to say these things along with me instead of repeating after me! I have introduced "10 Commandments for kids" and this week we are focusing on commandment 9 "thou shall not covet thy neighbor's house" Our theme this month is David and Goliath. The Bible story I have chosen for this week will be "best friends" (1 Samuel 16:14-23) we will also be creating hidden messages from the Bible with white crayon and watercolor. We are introducing orange this month and learning a helpful song called "the orange song" as well as using orange crayons, markers, colored pencils and paint to create orange artwork. This week we will be making oranges with construction paper. We will also be coloring the number 3 and gluing 3 poms to it. We have gotten our 2-month update on our cow, Salem, and will be discussing her in class this week. PRESCHOOL Pre-K3 News from Ms. Martin & Mrs. Bezler: We are halfway through October already! This week the kids are working on recognizing their own name and the order of their letters. We will start working on tracing their names as well. We have created some leaf and pumpkin outlines while using the color dot stampers. The kids enjoy collecting leaves, flowers, feathers, and grass while we are outside. Mrs. Bezler and I have been keeping these nature items for a bigger project later in the year. This

week we are starting to work on the letter Dd and going over number 7. We have read the bible story "A Good Hear" 1 Sammuel 15: 1-16: -3. While we learning about what it is to have a good heart, we are discussing good and bad choices as well. Express that helping others is a great way to show you have a good heart full of God's love. We are continuing to work on our fine motor skills to assist with their hand writing skills. PRE-SCHOOL Pre-K4 News from Ms. Candy West & Mrs. Khristina Seaton: This week in the Pre-K 4 classroom, we have been working with the number 9 and the letters H and h. We have changed our seasons and theme for October, so you will see Fall colors on our paper chains, hand cutouts, and leaves. The Ten Commandments studies have given us the opportunity to talk about "false testimony against our neighbors" and how this affects them. Our favorite activities this week were the slime, playdoh, and sand centers. We are getting to know Georgia and her family through our Family Tree project. It is amazing to witness our students beginning to understand the connection of the layers or generations within a family.

Kindergarten – 2nd Grade News from Mrs. Deborah Steinacher: For the week of Oct. 21, memory will be Psalm 46: 1-9. The class is doing a great job of learning the Psalm for the month, the Ten Commandments, The Lord's Prayer, and the Apostle's Creed. In religion we will be learning about when God gives Hannah a son. In reading and spelling we will be on unit 2.4. All of the students are doing a great job of reading their stories to me.
