We have made it all the way through this lessons and moving forward we will focus on retaining this information. Our theme this month is Fish and Bread. Mrs. Bezler: The kids cutting skills are starting to improve with the daily access to the cutting table lately. They have made a nice collection of confetti with all that little cuttings that they are learning to do. We've been learning the song "I am Thankful" by Angie Killian for our Thanksgiving service on November 24th. We are working on the letter Pp this week and reading the books "If you give a pig a pancake" and "If you give a pig a party!" by Laura Numeroff and Illustrated by Felicia Bond. We have been working on our song for Thanksgiving Service on November 24. That has made us want to talk about all the things that we are thankful for in our own lives. This week, I was thankful that the sun has come out again and just in time for our trip to the Library. In Math, we are learning the concept of less than to go along with the review of greater than. We also were excited to see how many different ways we can group things to make the number 7. The letters L and I seem to be easier for us to write and so our study of the alphabet continues. It has been a journey to detect which words begin with K rather than C at times as we reviewed words that begin with K. In gym class our friends have been learning and attempting to use basketball skills. They are progressing but the NBA will have to wait a few more years for us to get some more practice time on the court.
